The Epping Creative Centre (ECC) may not be the most beautiful building to look at, but it is certainly a place with a history and it holds a firm place in the psyche of many of the local people.

The NSW Heritage website describes the Dence Park location as “a remnant indigenous forest setting” and notes the presence of “native species” which “include Smooth Bark Angophora, Gnarled Banksia, Sydney Peppermint Stringybark and Turpentine”. The site is further described as “clearly identified by a tall Bunya Pine (about 22m high) and a Stone Pine (10m high) nearby probably planted between 1910-20.” I must confess to being a little wary of the heritage Bunya Pine which drops heavy cones that are also serious trip hazards, but I love the idea of it having stood and watched over the area for so long.

When it comes to the ECC building, there are few clues to the skeleton of the elegant Victorian family home that remains hidden inside the hotchpotch of randomly added rooms that every day come alive

with the chatter and laughter of dozens of people who gather there for a variety of social, cultural and educational activities.

The ECC was opened in September 1989, originally in the back rooms of the Dence Park building, while the front was leased out as a restaurant. In 1999 Hornsby Council granted full use of the building for community activities, “with an emphasis on creative and educational leisure activities.”

On 29th March 2000 I was among the 170 people at our Computer Club’s inaugural meeting at the then rather dilapidated Hornsby Council owned ECC. The groups who rented these rooms in the early days were able to obtain credit towards the rent by volunteering in the refurbishing and routine maintenance of the building. We at Computer Pals had some very generous volunteers who made a huge contribution with their time and expertise.

With changes in government and council policies and the identification of Epping as a “residential intensification area” and the

They could feel the value of this quiet oasis where people can come to socialize and renew themselves and they felt our passion and sense of "ownership" that stems from the hands-on contributions made towards the early development of the building and the "ECC Community".

I hope they can also see it may be hard for the "asset rich", but often "cash poor" older residents to accept the social isolation and incredible changes forced on them as they continue to live and move about in what was until a few years ago an elegant suburb with a lingering village atmosphere.

Avoid Scams!

When dealing with uninvited contacts from people or businesses, whether it's over the phone, by mail, email, in person or on a social networking site, always consider the possibility that the approach may be a scam. Remember, if it looks too good to be true, it probably is!

Do not open suspicious texts, pop-up windows or emails – **delete them.** If unsure, verify the identity of the contact through an independent source such as a phone book or online search. **Don't use the contact details provided in the message sent to you.**

Beware of any requests for your details or money. Never send money or give credit card details, online account details or copies of personal documents to anyone you don't know or trust.

Windows 10 Update

Members should be aware that the latest Windows 10 update 1607 commenced on 2nd August. This update will progressively be applied over the next few weeks. It is a very large download and will take some time. Seek advice from the Club if you have any queries.

App of the Month - TV Guide Australia ON AIR by stanwood GmbH

This is an invaluable free APP to view and choose free to air TV programs. There are multiple ways to view “what’s on”. Be sure to select the **stanwood GmbH**.



NOW - views the programs being broadcast now, plus the next program, for all channels.

PRIME TIME - views the period 7pm to about 10 pm.

OVERVIEW - shows a moving display from the current time forward of all programs.

You can see details such as the actors, the basic content, the year, the country, whether there are closed captions and more.

Through the Menu you can select future days. Also set reminders and more. It is quick and easy to use, a very intuitive APP and so much easier than searching paper program listings. If you wish, you can remove the advertisements by paying \$7.85 for the pro version, (Android, iTunes may be dearer.)
