Come, Enjoy, Share

At our General Meetings, we regularly have inspiring and interesting speakers - and very widely informed members, also, in the audience. I was surprised, at our most recent meeting, at just how much a number of our members knew about Rachel Henning, the subject of the presentation! One member even "trumped" our Presenter, by bring along a copy of a very early edition of Rachel Henning's letters - in better condition than the copy the Presenter had brought.

It is indeed amazing how different people's interest can be caught to the extent that they spend much time researching a topic. Our Speaker, Paul Storm, 'encountered' Rachel for the first time through stamp collecting. Interesting stamps led to interesting envelopes, thence to letters which were being cleared out of an old house by the renovator (fortuitously a stamp collector). Thus various letters were saved from the rubbish tip, and more information made available to both the family and the Mitchell Library. What a story it all made!

Whether the research is about someone encountered by chance or members of one's own family, much pleasure can be

gained from such detective work. We are fortunate that computers, and the internet, are tools which can be used in this way. Do we need fresh lessons on these topics? And then, our lessons in writing (both creative writing and word processing) can take things to the next level in documentation. As at least a couple of our own members have shared with us at different times, this can lead all the way to published books.

Even if you are reluctant to be quite so ambitious, it is well worth documenting family history, so the stories can be shared throughout the extended family, kept safely till the time when later generations are most receptive and interested. And these can be illustrated with family photos etc, such as in our Albums, Calendars and Greeting Cards classes. Getting the best out of our own photos, as well as older ones, is also covered in classes. And for other ways of presenting associated items, the irregular class "Share the Shoebox" has very worthwhile alternatives also.

Of course such research can lead to temporary embarrassment, whether (in earlier times, not now) through finding a convict in your family tree, or (these days!)

ELECTRICITY

Did You Know?

Since electricity is a natural force that exists in our world, it didn't have to be invented. It did, however, have to be discovered and understood.

Scientists have found evidence that ancient peoples may have experimented with electricity. In 1936, while excavating the ruins of a village near Baghdad, a clay pot was discovered that suggests that the first batteries may have been invented over 2,000 years ago. The clay pot contained copper plates, tin alloy, and an iron rod. It could have been used to create an electric current by filling it with an acidic solution, such as vinegar. This ancient battery is displayed in the Baghdad Museum.
